Presentation

Auckland District Health Board sets out to improve, promote, and protect the health of communities. By integrating primary and secondary healthcare services Auckland DHB works in conjunction with neighbouring DHB's in the northern region to ensure patients have the health services they need; while improving the efficiency and effectiveness of services. Operating across three major facilities, Auckland City Hospital is the largest public hospital and clinical research facility in New Zealand and observes more than one million patient contacts each year.

When patients enter a healthcare facility, they do so with the hope that they will leave in a healthier state than when they arrived. Hospital-acquired infections (HAIs) are at the forefront of healthcare and have a direct and significant impact. HAIs are typically infections that affect patients in a hospital setting and are not present at the time of admission.

The key to reducing the incidence of HCAs is to keep healthcare environments cleaned to the highest standard possible. There is still a need for methodical cleaning, disinfection and Cleaning Services at Auckland Hospital. It is an essential component in the effective infection prevention program and a critical factor in reducing HAIs. This presentation will cover the service transition that prompted the need for change; including a detailed overview of the framework developed and initiatives undertaken to transform and sustain Cleaning Services at Auckland District Health Board in response to the continually evolving landscape in healthcare.

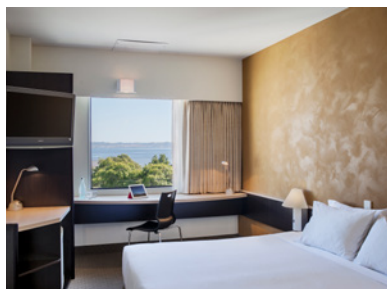

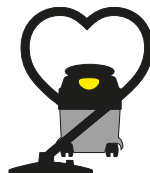
